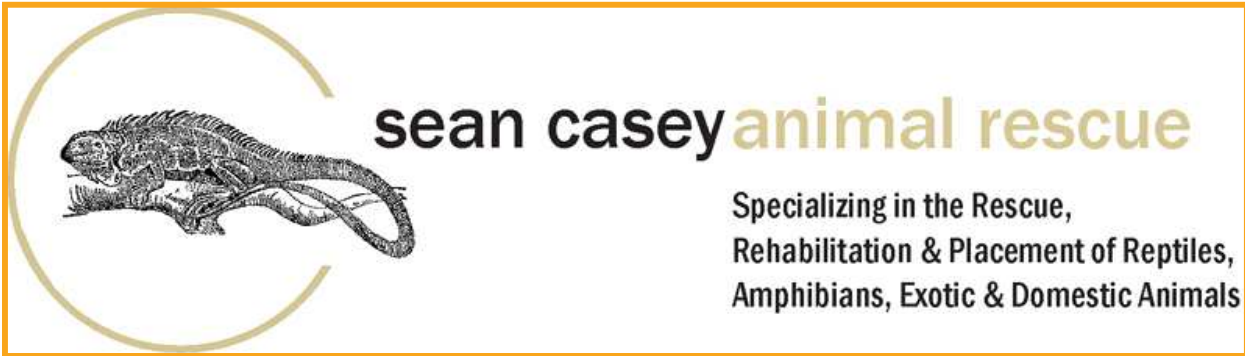
FIDO THANKSGIVING FEAST

- 1 tsp olive oil
- 1 egg
- 1/2 cup mashed potatoes
- 1/2 cup diced cooked turkey meat
- 1/2 cup chopped broccoli
- 1/2 cup grated cheddar cheese

1. Warm olive oil in medium-sized pan over medium heat.
2. In a small bowl, whisk together the mashed potatoes and egg.
3. Pour the potato and egg mix into the pan. Add the turkey and broccoli.
4. Cover the pan, reduce the heat to low, and simmer until the egg is cooked.
5. Top with the grated cheese and let it cook for a few minutes longer to allow the cheese to melt.
6. Let cool before serving.
