Muttville's Mission Statement

Muttville is a nonprofit organization dedicated to changing the way the world thinks about and treats older dogs, aged seven years and older, and to creating better lives for them through rescue, foster, adoption, and hospice.

Why the World Needs Muttville

We reach out to senior and special needs rescue dogs; find suitable homes for those dogs that are adoptable; and offer end of life care for those that are not. These are not just shelter dogs; every day, dogs are moved from loving homes to concrete cages because their guardians have died or moved or simply can't care for them anymore.

What Muttville Does

Through associations with shelters and other animal organizations, Muttville finds senior dogs that have been given up and are not likely to find adopted homes. Through outreach and networking, Muttville finds suitable new homes for these dogs. Ultimately, Muttville will have its own facility to house dogs that are not yet placed, or that are unlikely to be placed.

The Organization

Muttville was started in 2007 by Sherri Franklin, a longtime animal advocate and rescue worker. Sherri has spent years rescuing dogs, especially senior dogs. She recognized that the need was greater than she as an individual could ever address. So she decided to start Muttville, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization dedicated to improving the lives of older dogs through foster, adoption, education, and community.



Why adopt seniors? Debby E. from Virginia explains why.

In 2006 we adopted a 13.5 year old lab/chow mix named Clover. They simply didn't want her anymore because her health problems were too much trouble. After antibiotics and antiinflammatory medication she was like a new dog; running around and smiling. She lived to be almost 16! Then came Allie, an old beagle who wandered into our yard in 2008. What a sweet loving old beagle! She passed March 9th, 2014 at around 16. Then we adopted Georgie, a 13.5 year-old red tabby, from a local shelter. Georgie developed cancer and had to be euthanized April 21st of this year at 16.5. Soon after, a Facebook friend shared a post about Mystic, a 13-year old Senior Beagle. I showed her photos to my husband who told me


